INTERCLUB - USE OF RINKS

Men's, Women's and Mixed Interclub events as shown in the Club Handbook will require rinks on

- some Tuesday afternoons
- some Wednesday mornings and afternoons
- most Saturday mornings and afternoons
- some evenings throughout the season.
- some Sundays

SOCIAL MEMBERS

Social members are non-playing members. They are however, welcome to participate in all social and pavilion activities. They are also welcome to attend opening and closing days, over eighties day as well as any other event indicated in the programme.

All social members are entitled to play indoor bowls in winter.

DRESS CODE

MEN

Formal Dress

- White or cream trousers or walk shorts with white or cream walk or sports socks
- Club shirt, white or cream jersey or cardigan, jacket white or in Club colours
(For weekend Club play a navy pullover, cardigan or jacket may be worn with whites)

to be worn:

- For all Saturday and Sunday Championship, Trophy and Club play listed in the programme book (unless informed otherwise)
- By all players in Club finals or possible finals including singles marker
- For all men's morning and afternoon Centre fixtures including weekend Interclub events
- For all Men's Tournaments and Weekend Tournaments

Semi-Formal Dress

- White, cream or club shirt and white, cream or navy pullover, cardigan or jacket
- Reasonable dress trousers, walk shorts with walk or sports socks

to be worn for:

- All midweek Club play set out in the programme book, including Club Trophy events
- Midweek Interclub
- Evening Centre fixtures including Interclub events
- Midweek Mixed Tournaments

WOMEN

Formal Dress

- White skirts / trousers / shorts / culottes with club tops.

To be worn for:

- All centre fixtures including interclub events
- All players in Club finals including singles marker
- All women's open tournaments

Semi-Formal Dress - either:

- White skirts / trousers / shorts / culottes with white or navy tops. Or
- Navy trousers / shorts 1 culottes 1 skirts and cardigans with white or club tops

to be worn for:

- Women's Club Days
- Club Mixed days set out in the programme book
- Mixed Club Trophy events
- Evening Centre fixtures including interclub events
- Mixed Open Tournaments

GENERAL

There are no specific dress requirements for times other than stated above but a reasonable standard of tidy dress will be required.

SHOES

White or brown flat soled shoes to be worn at all times. Wedgies, shoes soled with ridges, seams or heels, and overshoes are not permitted on the greens.

CLOSING OF GREENS and CANCELLATION OF PLAY

1. If greens are closed for part of the day or the whole day a message will be recorded on the Club answer phone. Dial the Club phone number.
2. Red ball on the pole - green closed for the day.
Yellow ball on the pole - play may be possible later in the day.
3. Listen to Newstalk ZB (1098AM) at 7.30am and then every half hour.

DIRECTION OF PLAY

Please check the board for direction of play before bowling.
N.B. play after 4.30pm is in a north-south direction.

DUMPING and DROPPING BOWLS

Bowls should be delivered at green level. Dumping bowls at delivery causes damage to the playing surface. Players who dump their bowls may be required to play on outside rinks or those less susceptible to damage. Please ease the green keeper's task by delivering your bowls at green level.

TRANSISTOR RADIOS/CELLPHONES

In accordance with the Ruling of Bowls Canterbury Inc. and the Club Executive, transistor radios are not permitted on or within hearing of the greens.

Please keep cell phones switched off if you are on or beside the green while play is in progress.

NON SMOKING POLICY

The club has a '**No Smoking Policy**'. Smoking is not permitted in the clubrooms or on the greens at any time.

CLUB EQUIPMENT

At the end of play all mats, and jacks are to be returned to the storage shed.

Flip scoreboards are to be returned to zero and chalkboards cleaned.

Last member to leave the club premises is to ensure that all windows are closed, doors locked and the gate shut.

TRANSPORT

When playing away, it is usual for a contribution to be given to the driver towards the cost of petrol. The recommended contribution is advised beside the team notice.

MEN'S MID WEEK INTERCLUB GAMES

On Tuesdays the Club plays against other clubs according to the programme arranged by the Mid-Week Friendly Association. Members wishing to play in these games should write their

names on the white board in the Locker Room. Teams will be selected and names written on the board in the Locker Room on Wednesday afternoons, and then skips will be notified of their team members' names. Skips will notify members in their teams, place of play, times and transport arrangements. If some members are unavailable after accepting a place in a team, they must advise the selector immediately so substitute players can be selected. Home matches start at 1.00pm. WINTER INDOOR BOWLS

During the winter all members are encouraged to participate in the playing of bowls indoors (using outdoor bowls). Bowling takes place most days of the week and consists of both social and competition bowls run as men's, women's and mixed bowls. Members will be advised of the winter programme as well as the committee responsible for its organisation and control in March towards the end of the outdoor season. There is a cost of \$3 per session; (includes morning or afternoon tea).

BOWLING ARMS

LIQUOR LICENCE

The Club holds a Club Liquor Licence and this allows for liquor to be consumed both inside and outside the clubhouse. This includes the surrounding areas of both the number 1 and number 2 greens. Liquor is not to be consumed on the actual greens themselves and care needs to be taken with any glass.
